Déjà-Vu -- All Over Again

There's been nothing like it since "The Stand in the Schoolhouse Door."



On June 11, 1963, Governor George Wallace became a national symbol in bold defiance of federal law when he attempted to block the entrance of two black students to Foster Auditorium at the University of Alabama. It was a symbolic effort to honor his inaugural promise to support "segregation now, segregation tomorrow, segregation forever." Confronted on the spot by Deputy U.S. Attorney General Nicholas Katzenbach, supported by a phalanx of Federal Marshals, Wallace abandoned his one-man blockade and many years later in 1979 stated, "I was wrong. Those days are over, and they ought to be over."

Whether House Speaker John Boehner will eventually experience a similar "Road to Damascus" conversion remains to be seen, but he now embarrassingly stands in open rebellion against the expressed will of the American people in abject surrender to the most conservative elements of his hopelessly divided, morally bereft Republican Party.

Even while remaining under attack from ultra-extreme fringes calling for his immediate ouster as Speaker, Boehner announced last week in an abrupt turnaround that, while still not allowing a House vote on Immigration Reform for fear of instantaneous majority passage, he would yield to Tea Party pressure and approve a vote on defunding The Affordable Care Act of 2010 as the cost of approving a stopgap spending measure.

It was matter of principle!

"Limit" government?

Hell, why not just blow the whole thing up!

Or maybe that won't happen till a few more weeks when raising the debt ceiling to pay for things already purchased becomes hostage as it did thanks to the GOP in the summer of 2011—resulting in the first downgrade of credit in U. S. Government history. Factoring everything, a new study by the Bipartisan Policy Center indicates that fiasco will cost taxpayers \$18.9 billion over 10 years as a consequence of higher interest rates on government borrowing.

Experts warn that inability to make a deal this time around may well lead to an immediate risk of U.S. government default, a major financial crisis and downward economic momentum well on the road to deep and prolonged recession.

As President Obama properly observes, "We have not seen this in the past, that a budget is contingent on us eliminating a program that was voted on, passed by both chambers of Congress."

But that's where we seem to be—locked in a renewed confrontation with fantasy driven, tri-corner hat sporting, Obama hating, pretentiously posturing, self-designated "patriots" who

Mariposa Democratic Club September Speaker: Office of Emergency Services By Anne Brock

The Mariposa Democratic Club had a very interesting speaker at our Sept. meeting: Don Florence, head of the Office of Emergency Services. He covered a wide range of topics, including what the office does, the Hazard Mitigation Plan, and ways to reduce impact of fires. The club declared we want to have him come back because due to a lack of time we couldn't cover everything we wanted to hear about.

A couple things he mentioned that might be of interest—2 out of 3 power lines from Hetch Hetchy to San Francisco burned in the Rim Fire; that's costing San Francisco \$30 million a day to buy power and is why they got declared a disaster area before the area of the fire did. Mr. Florence highly recommended shaded fuel breaks to help reduce the spread of fires (you don't have to clear cut), but have your trees separated and trim up the limbs. And if you haven't signed up for Code Red yet—do it! Code Red registers your phone number (landline or cell) with the Sheriff's dept so that they can contact you in case of an emergency in your area.

Where did America Go?

This cut means even greater pain for single mothers, children—and I'm damned

So why in the hell do these morons keep reelecting those who further restrict the American dream, make it harder for them to survive, remove the desperately-needed safety nets and in general, just make their lives more difficult?


Besides this sick anti-American action, the House has wasted OUR time voting to repeal "Obamacare" 42 times to date though they know that any such attempts will fail in the Senate. Yet the totally spineless Boehner is terrorized by the small cadre of terrorist tea party House members and their latest act of stupidity is to pass a budget that defunds Obamacare. This is yet another attack on the poor, the working poor—and all those who will actually receive a subsidy under Obamacare to assist in purchasing health insurance.
