Oakhurst Rising

The liar's liar—red faced with rage—faced down the press with marked petulance.

Sean "The Brat" Spicer thus began his first official White House Press Briefing January 21st, shouting at those in attendance for lying to the American people about the Liar-In-Chief's smaller size.

At issue was the crowd count at the preceding day's Presidential Inauguration, estimated by media consensus at around 250,000 folks, although the new President claimed he personally saw "between a million and a million and a half."

The Women's March on Washington dwarfed Trump's audience on The Mall, even as it generated similar response in hundreds of cities nationally and globally.

Special congratulations are due to "Oakhurst Area for Peace." Winter's Rose

Winter's rose is found under the ground, beneath the snow, sleeping in the roots. It waits patiently for conditions to change before blossoming and fructifying. The devastation of winter endures one long season. We have a waiting period ahead, and then the rose will appear.

Politically we are looking at a Secretary of Labor who would destroy the minimum wage, a Secretary of Education who would do away with public education as we know it, a chief of the EPA who has opposed it most of his life, a Secretary of State who headed the world's largest oil company which has systematically discredited the reality of global warming, and a Secretary of Treasury who perhaps would be in prison for mortgage fraud under other circumstances. It's bleak and there comes a point when following the bleak news costs more than it's worth.

There are two things about the economy that grab my interest: inequality and the national debt.

A report from <u>inequality.org</u> dated January 9, 2017 displayed a graph comparing two 34-year periods—1946 to 1980 compared to 1980 to 2014. During the earlier period, the lower-earning 50% of households increased their incomes by 102% and the top 1% increased their incomes by 47%. In the latter period, the lower 50% increased their incomes by 1%, while the top 1% tripled their already high incomes. The <u>EPI.org</u> site "What should you be earning?" if your wage income had matched productivity gains as they did during the 1946 to 1980 period, shows these changes:

\$20,000 would be earning \$32,607 \$30,000 would be earning \$47,624 \$40,000 would earn \$61,360 \$50,000 would earn \$74,470 \$60,000 would earn \$84,668 \$70,000 would earn \$94,202

Now, about the national debt. I speak to my conservative neighbors and they are concerned. Didn't Obama double the national debt? Yes, he did, but he inherited the most devastating depression in 75 years. In 2000, federal revenue was 20% of the yearly GDP, and in 2008 (last year of GWB's term), it was 14%. That's a loss of close to \$900 billion in revenue. Obama was not in office in 2008. He inherited this mess.

Why didn't he fix it? During the 8-year Obama presidency, the Senate Republicans doubled the previous record for filibusters. They also threatened to default on the national debt interest payments. These payments today are 6% of the GDP but ran as high as 17% of GDP in 1994. Reagan increased interest payments about triple what Obama did.

Our Congressman, McClintock, recently delivered a speech to Congress urging the elimination of the filibuster in the Senate. He's about 8 years too late and deserves an award for hypocrisy.

The national debt is \$20 trillion. The total household net worth (private savings of private individuals and families) is \$90 trillion. It doesn't take a genius to understand that the debt is payable. The hysteria about not being able to pay it is a political choice not to tax the wealthy 1% who own 42% of this \$90 trillion. The value of all financial assets increased by \$33.4 trillion since 2009, a gain of 64% adjusting for inflation, during the worst economic maelstrom in 75 years, while the national debt increased by \$10 trillion, and the median household's net worth dropped by 40%. That's a complicated sentence saying that the wealthy did very well, while most people lost almost half their life savings and the government plunged into deeper debt. Most often politicians will say that financial assets cannot be taxed. They can be. Scholars are proposing such plans and we, of course, could legislate a tax if necessary. As I reported in another newsletter in 1999, Trump

proposed a 14% tax on wealth to pay down the debt. He now denies he made the proposal but CNN quotes him extensively explaining the deal.

We confront at least 4 years of radical right wing solutions. Cutting away health care insurance from 32 million Americans (by 2026) seems like a plan for igniting a political backlash. I find it exhausting to think about the proposals that are beyond the pale. But the Rose is not dead, it sleeps through winter. I spoke with a woman who voted for Trump. She is an amazing, likable and competent human. I told her the burden is on Trump and his supporters to improve conditions. Maybe they, and all others including sleepy Democrats and Independents, will start paying attention and applying their creative energies and their heart's empathy to our national problems.
